

# Fort Henry 1774 - 1786

## Builders, Defenders, & Occupants

When the government put up the money and there was an order to build a fort, the name was preceded by the word fort. Such as Fort Pitt, Fort Laurens or Fort Henry. When a fort was built by a land owner or such, the name came first as in Rice's Fort, or Shepherd's Fort.

Fort Henry, as it came to be known, had an actual service life of about 13 years. From 1774-1786. When the fort was built in 1774 it was known as Fort Fincastle in honor of the Royal Governor of Virginia. In 1776 it was renamed in deference to Governor Patrick Henry.

Fort Henry, at Wheeling, was built at the expense of the English Government, by the order of the Earl of Dunmore, while on his campaign against the Indians in the summer of 1774, who, when he descended the river in pursuit of the Indians on the Scioto, left Colonel William Crawford and Angus McDonald, with a detachment of men to build and garrison the fort. The fort was located about one quarter mile north of the entrance to Wheeling Creek on a bluff that overlooked the Ohio River in what is now Wheeling, West Virginia. The stockade was substantially built. It consisted of squared white oak timbers, pointed at the top and furnished with bastions and sentry boxes at the angles with port holes for rifles and muskets both above and below. The interior of the fort contained the commandant's house, a two-story structure for the officers, a one-story store house, and barracks for the garrison as well as cabins for families. There was also a well within its walls. The fort's area was something more than half an acre. This fort was designed for the refuge and protection of the lower settlements in this district of the country, and being next in strength and importance to Fort Pitt. (a-pg 54, 55; l-pg 220).

There were two major sieges at Fort Henry. The first, occurred on September 1 & 2, 1777 when a force of British and more than 350 Indians attacked the approximately 45 defenders in the fort. The final casualty count was 15 dead and 5 wounded for the defenders and 3 dead and 5 wounded for the attackers (a-pg 64). On October 18, 1781 Fort Henry received a small French swivel cannon that had been discovered in the river outside Fort Pitt. It had been thrown there in 1758 when the French burned Fort Duquesne and since had been reconditioned. The residents quickly formed a work party to build a platform in the middle of the fort to hold the "new" piece of artillery. The second siege took place when approximately 100 men, women and children took refuge in the fort for 3 days from September 11 - 13, 1782 when 40 British Rangers and about 260 Indians attacked the fort. This would be the last time British soldiers would face the American militia during the Revolutionary War.

Many believe West Virginia to be the site of the first and last battles of the American Revolution. With the first taking place at Point Pleasant on October 10, 1774 and the last being

Fort Henry in 1782.

No list will ever be complete with all the people that ever occupied this fort. But the following, taken from various sources, is an attempt to list any individuals that stayed at Fort Henry at any time during its 13 year existence. Regardless of the length of time, even if just used as a rendezvous point. Documented sources are listed.

Column 1 contains surname; Column 2 is the given name; Column 3 is when service took place ( 1-first siege, 2-second siege, 3-any documented service); Column 4 reference to footnotes along with page number or other reference numbers as needed; Column 5 any brief notes.
